MEDICAL COURSE FOR NON-FILIPINO STUDENTS

The Manila Times College of Subic International School of Health Sciences offers a 5½ year course leading to the degree of Doctor of Medicine (M.D.).

Admission is on a quota system. Only the top one hundred (100) applicants will be admitted per year, based on examination scores and pre-university grades.

Admission to the program requires students to have undergone at least twelve (12) years of pre-university education in a country other than the Philippines. A certification to this effect is required upon filing admission papers.

Students also need to pass an Entrance Examination based on the Medical College Admission Test used in Australia, Canada, and the United States. Admitted students need to score at least 60% on the test (or 60 percentile). For purposes of obtaining a Philippine degree, students have to pass the National Medical Admission Test, administered every March and November; no minimum grade is required, but candidates stand a better chance of being admitted if their grade is above 70.

The goal of the curriculum is to develop medical doctors who are competent, motivated, and honest. The Manila Times College (TMTC), of which the Manila Times College of Subic is a subsidiary, believes that integrity and competence go hand in hand. A strict code of ethics and conduct is observed in all departments of TMTC. Such a code is expected to be followed by all graduates of TMTCS throughout their careers.

TMTCS, adhering to the educational philosophy of TMTC, follows the German model of dual training, in which practical training in the laboratory or workplace is considered as important as theoretical instruction in the classroom. TMTCS owns the George Dewey Medical Center, which is on its campus, and makes sure that all its students do immersion and internship work in the hospital. TMTCS also requires its students to be physically fit and, therefore, incorporates Physical Education in all its courses of studies. PLUS MUSIC

The TMTCS MD program follows a quarter system, with three 14-week trimesters and one 6-week summer session. There is a 4-week break during the New Year holidays.

The curriculum is based on the Philippine General Education Curriculum, the Philippine medical curriculum, and the international curriculum for Bachelor of Medicine and Bachelor of Surgery (MBBS).
